Wishing you a safe and happy festive season!

12 days of Christmas safety!

1 Check your Christmas light strings before you hang them discard any with frayed cords or loose connections. Replace bulbs with the correct wattage and voltage.

2 Buy good quality Christmas lights that meet UK home safety standards.

3 Switch off Christmas lights before you go to bed.

- 4 Don't overload electrical sockets.
- **5** Check outdoor lights are suitable for outdoors use (they should be specially insulated).
- 6 Never leave Christmas candles unattended.

7 If you have an artificial tree, make sure it's flame retardant.

- 8 Lock your doors and windows burglary rates are always higher this time of year.
- 9 Consider a timer switch for lights to deter thieves.

10 Don't post your plans on social media so that criminals know your home is empty

11 Similarly, don't tempt thieves by advertising your

12 Protect children - only buy 'kitemarked' age-suitable toys and beware choking hazards (eg Christmas cracker toys).

And remember to test your fire alarm!



Christmas trees

Take your tree to the local council collection point or tip for recycling to make chippings for parks etc

Christmas cards and envelopes Recycle with your paper waste or drop them in supermarket collection points

Don't throw it away!

Wrapping paper

Do the 'scrunch' test - if it springs back it is foil based and can't be recycled. Otherwise, recycle with household paper waste

Batteries

Recycle batteries at your local supermarket. Or if you live in one of sheltered schemes, use the shiny new battery bins we've provided!
